CPATH is excited to host our 5th annual Camp CPals on May 8-10, 2020 at Camp For All in beautiful Burton, Texas. We would love for your family to participate! Camp CPals is designed for families living with cerebral palsy as a way to relax and enjoy time as a family for a weekend. You will have fun, forget the stresses of daily life, and enjoy the company of other families.

To apply, Camp CPals requires that your child be between the ages of 5-18 years old and have a cerebral palsy diagnosis. (Some activities such as Ziplining require children to be 6 or older.) You may bring up to three siblings within the same age range. At least one parent or guardian must attend Camp CPals and a maximum of two parents or guardians may attend. **Camp CPals is free of cost to families.**

Please fill out the application clearly and completely. The completion of this application does not guarantee you will be accepted to Camp CPals. Once the application is received in full, you will receive an email or a phone call letting you know whether you have been accepted to camp or placed on the waitlist.

Acceptance is based on:

1. Priority for 1st time campers turning in applications before February 15, 2020.
2. First come first serve basis.

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Application Instructions

Camp CPals is a weekend retreat for Central Texas families living with cerebral palsy from Friday May 8, 2020 to Sunday May 10, 2020. Cabin space limits the number of families that can attend. Children should be between the ages of 5 and 18 and one child must have a diagnosis of cerebral palsy. At least one parent or guardian must attend. Cousins or friends may NOT substitute for a sibling.

Camp is free of charge to all participants.

Application

Please fill out the application clearly and completely. The completion of this application does not guarantee you will be accepted to Camp CPals. Once this application is received in full, you will receive an email or a phone call letting you know whether you have been accepted to camp or have been placed on the waitlist. Acceptance is based on a first come first serve basis with priority given to first time campers applying before February 15, 2020. For applications submitted through USPS, the postmark date will be used as the date received.

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General Camp Information

- CPATH's Family Camp is provided free of charge for participants.
- Family Camp will be held at the Camp For All facility which is located 1.5 hours from Austin, outside of Burton, Texas. Families must provide their own transportation.
- Two families will be housed together in retreat style cabin. Each family will have two private bedrooms and one large bathroom. The cabins have a shared kitchen/living space.
- The retreat cabins are temperature controlled and the beds are comfortable.
- Camp For All is able to provide meal plans to meet most dietary needs and allergies. All meals will be provided by Camp For All.
- A maximum number of 6 family members may attend Family Camp - a child with CP, up to three siblings and one or two parents or guardians.
- To ensure your entire family can participate, Camp For All recommends Family Camp for ages 5 and up. Some activities have a minimum age of 6 years old for safety.
- Camp activities may include ropes course, archery, fishing, arts and crafts, horseback riding, sports, and more. All activities are fully accessible.
- It is important that each family member obtains clearance from his or her doctor to attend Family Camp. Medical Release forms will be available in March and due back April 24th.
- If your family is accepted and your plans change, please contact CPATH immediately. Other participants are waiting for the opportunity to attend camp.
